- (4) The Member Secretary, JHALSA informed the committee that as per the direction of High Powered Committe, he has published the decisions of High Power Committee on website of Jharkhand State Legal Services Authority and intimated the Hon'ble High Court of Jharkhand.
 - (5) The Committee reiterated the principle contained in the resolution of the High Powered Committee Meeting dated 17.05.21 regarding release of Undetrial Prisoners on bail / interim bail i.e those who are involved in the offence punishable up to 7 (seven) years imprisonment and are not involved in heinous or economic offences or the offences relating to Naxal activities and have no or less criminal antecedents.
- (6) The Committee also reiterated the resolution of the High Powered Committee Meeting dated 07.04.20 that as far as the issue of parole is concerned, State Government should consider granting of parole as per rules framed by it in this regard.
- (7) The Committee is unanimous on the issue that as per the resolution of High Powered Committee dated 17.05.21, the conditions applicable to the release of undertrial prisoners on bail / interim bail also apply in the matter of release of convicts on parole.
- (8) The Committee is further unanimous on the issue that the order of granting parole to the convicts must be as per **the Jharkhand Prisoner's Parole Rule, 2012.**

The Committee therefore unanimously resolves as under:

- (A) The grant of Parole shall be strictly as per the provisions of the **Jharkhand Prisoner's**Parole Rules, 2012.
- (B) The principles and conditions as enumerated in earlier resolution of this Committee for grant of bail / interim bail to the Undertrial Prisoners who are involved in the offence punishable up to 7 (seven) years imprisonment and are not involved in heinous or economic offences or the offences relating to Naxal activities and have no or less criminal antecedents apply in the matter of convicts to be released on parole.
- **(C)** The I.G. Prison shall review the Parole of 153 convicts in the light of Resolution **A** and Resolution **B** above within a time frame.
- (D) Principal Secretary to the Government of Jharkhand, Department of Home, Prisons and Disaster Management, I.G. (Prison) and Member Secretary JHALSA shall take steps for

publication of the decisions of High Power Committee on websites of Government of Jharkhand, Jharkhand State Legal Services Authority and High Court of Jharkhand.

(E) The next virtual meetings of the committee shall be held after 3 weeks. Meeting may be preponed at a short notice, if the situation so demands.
