I am writing to you in my capacity as Chairman of the International Committee of the Judicial College of the UK.

The Judicial College has developed a new "International Business of Judging" Course and would like to offer it to our esteemed judicial colleagues in other jurisdictions. I am pleased to extend to you an invitation to nominate two of your judges to attend this course in England between 3-4<sup>th</sup> March 2016.

The course is tailored to suit an international audience and focuses on judicial skills in a number of key areas:

- dealing appropriately with ethical and other problems which confront judges inside and outside the court
- assessing the credibility and reliability of evidence
- providing sound and well-structured reasons for decisions
- learning how to increase judicial resilience
- dealing with high conflict and unexpected situations in the court.

The course will take place over two days on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> March 2016 at Highgate House in Northamptonshire and will be delivered in English.

Participants will gain the maximum benefit from the course if they are judicial trainers in their own jurisdictions as well as judicial office holders. A good working knowledge of English is a pre-requisite. The training and accommodation, for the duration of the course (2 nights) will be provided and


paid for by the Judicial College, but participants will be expected to make and fund their own travel arrangements.
