- 3. Identify cases for Plea Bargaining through those Magistrates/Law Students, who have visited Jail as well through Trial Courts.
- 4. Initiate Special Drive at regular interval to dispose of cases identified as above through the process of Plea Barganing.

UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following ORDER

Heard Mr. Anupam Lal Das, learned counsel for the petitioner.

In a similar matter being W.P.(C)No.480/2018, we had passed the following order:

"Though we appreciate the concern expressed by the petitioner with regard to the pendency of the cases in the subordinate judiciary, yet we do not intend to issue any mandamus at present as the steps have allready been taken by the High Courts to fill up the vacancies in the subordinate judiciary. Needless to say that is the only prayer in the writ petition we have addressed to as other prayers do not require any consideration."

At this juncture, Mr. Anupam Lal Das, submitted that Section 265A of the Code of Criminal Procedure which relates to 'Plea Bargaining' has not yet been adequately taken recourse to and the trial courts are required to do so to fulfill the statutory purpose. ... /2

Be it noted, in certain States, the State Legal Services
Authorities and the District Legal Services Authorities have
educated people with regard to 'plea bargaining' and involved
the Magistracy and the law students to visit the prisons and
apprise the undertrial prisoners the benefit of plea

accentuated and accordingly it is directed that the Member
Secretaries of the respective State Legal Services Authorities
shall take effective steps for identifying cases for plea

can be well spread and the requisite result can be achieved.

The writ petition is disposed of accordingly.
