STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE FOR EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTING THE SEVEN SCHEMES OF NATIONAL LEGAL SERVICES AUTHORITY

INTRODUCTION:

The 13th All India Meet of State Legal Services Authorities was organized at Ranchi on 21st and 22nd of the March 2015 in which several resolutions for reaching consequences were adopted. In tune with those resolutions, the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) launched following even schemes at New Delhi on 7th of November, 2015 on the eve of Legal Services Day (9th of November, 2015)

- **NALSA (Victims of Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation) Scheme, 2015.**
- NALSA (Legal Services to the Workers in the Unorganized Sector) Scheme, 2015.
- NALSA (Child Friendly Legal Services to Children and their Protection) Scheme, 2015.
- NALSA (Legal Services to the mentally ill and Mentally Disabled Persons) Scheme, 2015.
- **NALSA (Effective Implementation of Poverty Alleviation Schemes) Scheme, 2015.**
- NALSA (Protection land Enforcement of Tribal Rights) Scheme, 2015.
- NALSA (Legal Services to the Victims of Drug Abuse and Eradication of Drug Menace) Scheme, 2015.

The resolutions of 13th All India Meet of SLSAs as also, the recently launched Seven Schemes are to be implemented in letter and spirit. The PLVs and Legal Services empanelled Panel Lawyers are the main work force of the Legal Services Institutions. The NGO/Social Activist, persons working in the field of Relief and Rehabilitation of Sex Works, Trafficking, Child Rights, Differently able persons, Tribal people and Drug Abuse are also required to be associated with Legal Services Institutions. Therefore, need was felt for evolving comprehensive Standard Operating Procedure to be followed by all District Legal Services Authorities across the State for effective implementation of NALSA's 7 Schemes.

Standard Operating Procedure (methodology) to implement the said 7 NALSA schemes is as under:

- To constitute 7 teams for each 7 NALSA schemes separately at District level by each District Legal Services Authority.
- Each team shall take responsibility to implement its own NALSA scheme, say, Team A for NALSA (Victims of Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation) Scheme, 2015, Team B for NALSA (Legal Services to the Workers in the Unorganized Sector) Scheme, 2015, Team C for NALSA (Child Friendly Legal Services to Children and their Protection) Scheme, 2015, Team D for NALSA (Legal Services to the Mentally III and Mentally Disabled Persons) Scheme, 2015, Team E for NALSA (Effective Implementation of Poverty Alleviation Schemes) Scheme, 2015, Team F for NALSA (Protection and Enforcement of Tribal Rights) Scheme, 2015, Team G for NALSA (Legal Services to the Victims of Drug Abuse and Eradication of Drug Menace) Scheme, 2015.
- The number of members of a Team shall be determined by concerned DLSA depending, interalia, upon areas, population etc. of District.
- One team leader of each team may be nominated by DLSA. The details of each team constituted for 7 NALSA schemes shall be sent to JHALSA.
- One nodal officer from executive side for effective implementation of all 7 NALSA's scheme be deputed by Deputy Commissioner-cum-Vice Chairman of DLSA for each District.
- To impart training to the members of the each team about their respective schemes, interalia, including about the provisions of Act and Welfare Schemes of Central and State Government for the benefit of the Target Groups of the respective NALSA Scheme. Chairman of each DLSA will constitute a Team of Judicial Officers, the Secretary, DLSA, Advocates, Executive Officers etc. to impart Training of 7 Schemes of NALSA to the members of each team.

- Process of imparting training to each team about their respective schemes shall be completed by 31st January, 2016 and thereafter from February, 2016 each team shall start holding Legal Awareness Camps/Services for implementing their respective schemes in letter and spirit in the concerned District.
- It shall be duty of the concerned team to create awareness and to disseminate knowledge amongst all stake holders about the provisions of law and welfare schemes of Central and State Govt. of respective NALSA schemes and to ensure that the persons entitled to get the benefit under the schemes are actually benefitted.
- It shall be duty of the members of the each team to take applications of the aggrieved entitled persons covered under the respective scheme and shall redress their grievances by coordinating with the concerned Personnel of the Govt. at District level through the concerned DLSA.
- Each team so constituted for each of the 7 NALSA schemes separately shall hold minimum of 2 Awareness Camps/Legal Services Camps preferably on 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month in the District. Further each team for the rest of the days of month shall indulge in intensive activities through various Legal Aid Clinics of the District or otherwise with a view to transmit knowledge about the NALSA scheme and with a view to spread consciousness about the legal rights and duties of citizens including male & female with reference to the particular NALSA scheme for each team and to ensure that benefits are reaching to the entitled persons.
- In such Legal Awareness/Services Camps it shall be the obligation of the team members to spread awareness and to ensure rights to the right holders and thereafter each team shall inform to the Chairman and Secretary of the DLSA in detail about the activities on the last Saturday of each month i.e. on the clearance day of each month to take appropriate direction/necessary instructions and to apprise the development of their assigned job. Each team shall prepare and document its entire activities of imparting awareness and providing services with details of the beneficiaries and photographs of successful story. Each DLSA shall send the report on quarterly basis to the JHALSA for onward transmission to the NALSA about these 7 NALSA schemes separately in the format given below:

The aforesaid Standard Operating Procedure for implementing the 7 schemes of NALSA are indicative and not exhaustive. There is a need to follow such aforesaid Standard Operating Procedure for making the said NALSA's scheme a reality and more result and delivery oriented.

TRAINING MODULE FOR THE TEAM MEMBERS OF EACH DISTRICT CONSTITUTED FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF 7 NALSA SCHEMES

This is the Training Module for Judicial Officers, PLVs, Panel lawyers, NGOs or social activists or any other persons constituting 7 teams in each districts for effective implementation of NALSA 7 schemes. There are 7 teams in each districts of Jharkhand as under:

Team A: NALSA (Victims of Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation) Scheme, 2015

- Team B: NALSA (Legal Services to the Workers in the Unorganized Sector) Scheme, 2015
- Team C: NALSA (Child Friendly Legal Services to Children and their Protection) Scheme, 2015.
- Team D: NALSA (Legal Services to the mentally ill and Mentally Disabled Persons) Scheme, 2015
- Team E: NALSA (Effective Implementation of Poverty Alleviation Schemes) Scheme, 2015
- Team F: NALSA (Protection land Enforcement of Tribal Rights) Scheme, 2015
- Team G: NALSA (Legal Services to the Victims of Drug Abuse and Eradication of Drug Menace) Scheme, 2015

The aim of the training is to concentrate on providing knowledge about the relevant provisions of Constitution of India, Fundamental rights and duties, Legal Services Authority Act, 1987. NALSA Regulations and Schemes, Important Judgments of the Hon'ble High Courts and Apex Court and Laws related to the schemes of NALSA, Various Welfare Schemes of Central and State Govt. related to NALSA 7 Schemes.

MODALITIES:

Ideally Team members comprising Panel lawyers, social activists, PLV, NGOs, Judicial Officers, teachers, students or any other persons etc. should be imparted training under this module of training and for this purpose the training programme may be organized at some intervals for each team separately and also jointly from time to time as per need and requirement.

NGOs working in the field referred to above have to be associated with an aim to achieve the desired result. They are the people through whom the Legal Services Institution can take the benefits of these schemes of NALSA directly to the target group. Further Educational Institutions be also associated to implement the Schemes into reality.

DURATION:

This shall be a two days training programme at District level for the Joint Team Members, One Day separately for each team and one day State Level Colloquium shall be organized at Nyaya Sadan as Advanced Training Programme twice in a year.

CERTIFICATE:

On successful participation in the training, the Certificate of Participation shall be issued to the participants.

QUARTERLY REPORTS:

A quarterly report shall be submitted by the DLSA to the SLSA, Scheme wise. Records shall be maintained for each and every activity under each scheme and separate record shall be maintained for the beneficiaries. Periodical and randomly cross-checking shall be done by the Secretary of the DLSA, by talking to the beneficiary through telephone/ mobile.

Expenses incurred in the training Programme as also in Awareness Programme or preparing Publicity materials as the Schemes.

Reasonable expenditure may be made in organizing training programme with strict observance of austerity and evidence of extravagance. The arrangement shall be made for afternoon lunches. The NALSA fund or the allotment made by JHALSA from amount of grant/ allotment made by the State Government may be used for meeting out the expenses.
